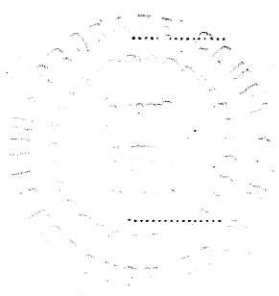

Know all men by these presents,
That I, Frank M. Woodbury of
Pelham in the County of Hillsborough
and State of New Hampshire, consid-
ering the uncertainty of life and being
of sound and perfect mind and mem-
ory, do make publish and declare, this
my last will and testament in manner
and form as follows;

First. I direct my executrix herein
named to pay all my just debts
and expenses as soon as may be
convenient after my decease.

Second. I give and bequeath to
my sister Alice A. Gago if living
at my decease the sum of one hundred
dollars.

Third. I give and bequeath to my sis-
ter Eliza J. Peabody if living at my
decease the sum of one hundred dollars.

Fourth. I give and bequeath to my
nephew John W. Peabody the gold
watch and chain which was my
father's and for whom he was named

Fifth. As to all the rest residue and
remainder of my estate, of every
kind and nature I give bequeath

and, devise said residue and remainder, to my beloved wife Fenna Belle Woodbury, to her and her heirs forever.

Sixth. In the event of the death of my wife before my decease, or before she may be legally possessed of said residue and remainder, I give, bequeath and devise the same to the Town of Pelham New Hampshire the same to be invested by said town and to be known as the Frank M. Woodbury Fund, the interest only of said Fund to be used by said Town in any manner they may see fit, by a vote at any annual, or legally called meeting.

Seventh. I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Fenna B. Woodbury sole executrix of this my last will and testament and ask that she be excused from giving securities upon her bond.
